

## Minutes

THE CITY OF TUTTLE COUNCIL MEMBERS MET IN REGULAR WORKSHOP SESSION ON **FEBRUARY 27, 2023, AT 6:00 P.M.** IN THE TUTTLE CITY HALL BUILDING LOCATED AT 221 W. MAIN STREET

**CALL TO ORDER** McLeroy called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m.

### **ORDER OF BUSINESS**

1. PRESENTATION by TSET (Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust) regarding the healthy incentive program  
**Schoening introduced Jodi Smith from TSET. J. Smith presented what TSET does and has accomplished. She presented the Youth Tobacco prevention the program that prevents youth under 21 from getting tobacco products. She stated if the City participates you will be eligible for up to \$50,000 of grant money. The city would need to adopt the enabling ordinance, and this allows ABLE Commission to do random checks on convenience stores. If stores are selling to under 21 they can be fined. The grant funds can be used for any project or as matching funds.**
2. PRESENTATION regarding Disc Golf Course at the Tuttle Soccer Park  
**Littleton presented the map with the proposed hole sites and discussed the progress on cleaning the site. Perryman stated nothing can be buried in the right-of-way areas of the gas lines. Littleton stated a complete set of baskets costs \$8000 and are looking for donations. He stated he wants the overall park to look good.**
3. DISCUSSION of Zoning Ordinances  
**Schoening asked if any questions about zoning. Hughes stated farm animals, and lots splits need more discussion.**
4. DISCUSSION of Subdivision Ordinances  
**Schoening stated lot splits and related codes are up to interpretation. McLeroy discussed livestock on non-agricultural land and how to regulate the number of head. Perryman stated can't regulate fairly unless you have so many feet per animal and code enforcement will have to enforce.**
